Chef Alan Fitzmaurice is Executive Chef at The Glasshouse Hotel Sligo and member of the Irish Culinary Team, he won silver at the Culinary Olympics in Germany and later earned bronze at the Global Chef Challenge World Final in Abu Dhabi.

Chef Alan is President of the Panel of Chefs of Ireland, mentors the Irish Culinary Youth Team, and was the captain of the Senior Culinary Team to double bronze at the 2024 Culinary Olympics in Stuttgart. In 2026, he achieved gold and class winner at IFEX Belfast, and also led the Irish team at the World Congress of Chefs in Wales in support of hospitality charities.

ENTRIES & ENTRY FEES

- All entries must be accompanied by the correct entry fee where applicable.
- Entries received without the appropriate fee will not be accepted.
- Exhibits not properly entered will not be permitted to compete.

2



OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry. No substitution of any animal or exhibit is permitted after entry.

3



PROOF OF AGE

Where age is a qualification, the appropriate passport or registration document must be produced upon request.

4



ANIMAL PASSPORTS & MICROCHIPS

Animal passports and microchips may be examined by the Veterinary Surgeon where applicable.

The Veterinary Surgeon's decision shall:

- ✓ Be final.
- ✓ Remain confidential to the Show Committee unless otherwise required.
- ✓ Be limited to certification of "Sound" or "Unsound."

Where height is a qualification, prize-winning animals may be measured by the Veterinary Surgeon.

OBJECTIONS

- Objections must be submitted in writing.
- Lodged with the Section Office within 30 minutes of the completion of judging.
- Accompanied by a €50 deposit.

**€50
DEPOSIT**

The deposit may be forfeited if the objection is considered frivolous.

Objections concerning ownership must be lodged within 8 days of the Show.

CONDUCT ON SHOW DAY

The Committee expects courteous and respectful behaviour from all exhibitors and visitors.

Anyone behaving in an inappropriate or abusive manner may be removed from the Show Grounds.

7



IDENTIFICATION & LIABILITY

Animals bearing unauthorised ownership marks will not be eligible to compete.

(All ordinary initial brands are exempt.)

All exhibits compete entirely at the owner's risk. The Society accepts no responsibility for loss, damage, or injury to persons or property.

8



HORSE REGULATIONS

- Young horses must wear suitable headgear.
- Horses over one year old must be properly bitted.

9



CATTLE REGULATIONS

- Bulls must be shown with a nose ring and chain or rope attached.
 - All other cattle must be led using suitable halters.
- These regulations will be strictly enforced.

10



RING & JUDGING REGULATIONS

No Steward may remain in the ring while exhibiting in the class being judged.

Only the following persons may enter the ring during judging:

- Judge
- Judge's Steward
- Person in charge of the exhibit

Any exhibitor breaching this rule will be disqualified.

11



COMMUNICATION WITH JUDGES

No exhibitor or sponsor may communicate with a Judge during judging of any class in which they are competing.

The term "Ring" includes any judging area or marquee.

Failure to comply will result in disqualification.

12



PROGRAMME ALTERATIONS

The Committee reserves the right to amend or alter the programme at any time if necessary.

13



BREACH OF RULES

Any exhibitor who breaches these Rules & Conditions may:

- Forfeit any prize awarded.
- Be required to return any prize received.
- Be removed from the Show Grounds.

AUTHORITY OF STEWARDS & COMMITTEE

Stewards and Officials have full authority on Show Day.

Any act of disobedience may result in:

- Immediate dismissal.
- Loss of prizes.
- Referral to the Committee of Management.

The Committee may meet at 2.00 p.m. to consider objections or irregularities.

Its decision shall be final.

Fraudulent practices will result in all prizes being forfeited to the Society.

LIVESTOCK IDENTIFICATION

All Sheep and Cattle must:

- ✓ Be individually identified with the appropriate ear tags.
- ✓ Be correctly recorded on the AIM system where applicable.
- ✓ Be accompanied by the relevant compliance documentation.

All Equines must be accompanied by valid passports.



Failure to comply constitutes an offence.

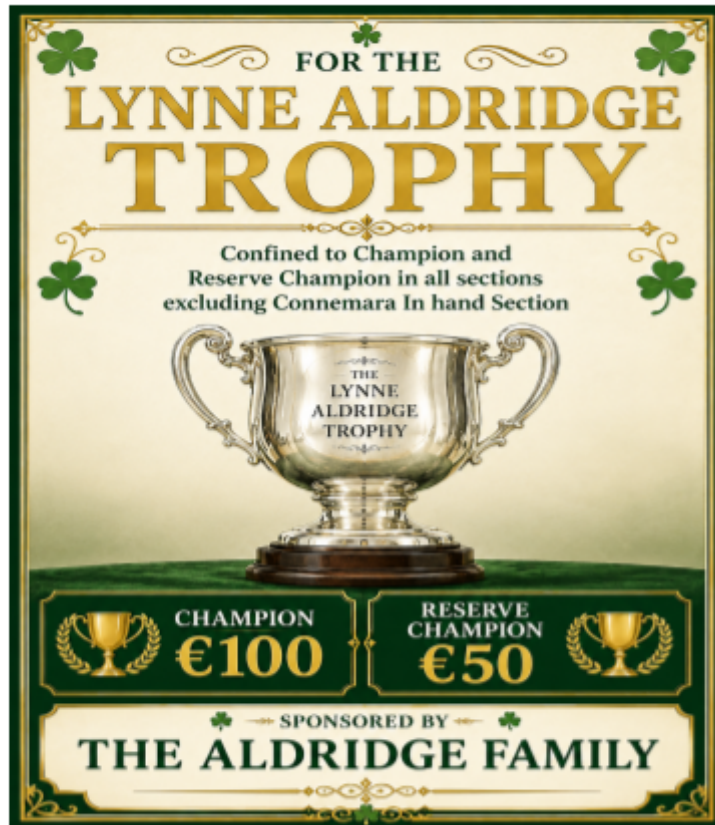

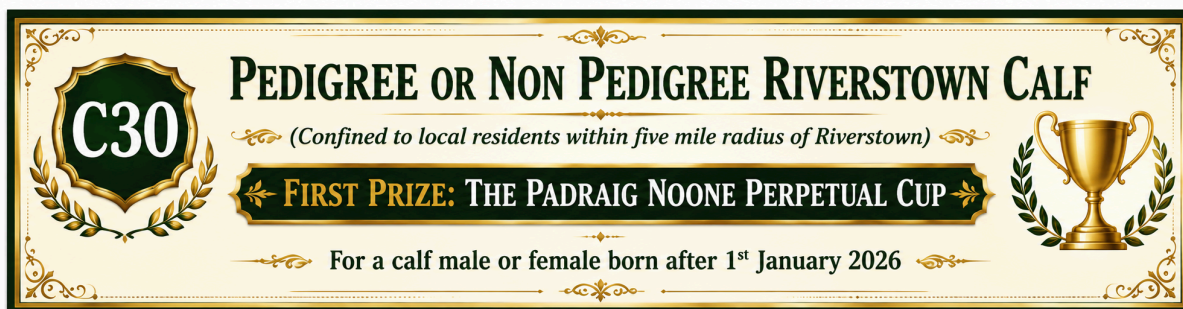
